

Member satisfaction survey starts this month



We want to know what our members think, feel, believe, want and know. During the next few months, CVEC will be sponsoring a survey that is conducted every three years to measure the quality of service provided to our members. The research will identify key drivers of satisfaction and loyalty allowing cooperative leadership to target areas where we can improve on our members' expectations. This survey will give us a better understanding of current attitudes of cooperative members, a critique of our performance as service providers, an evaluation of member communication channels and a demographic overview of our diverse membership.

Member surveys will begin in mid-September and conclude mid-December. In this random survey of members, a mixture of online and telephone interviews will be conducted. You may be sent an email invitation to participate in the survey, or you may be sent a postcard in the mail inviting you to participate. Members also may be randomly selected to complete a telephone interview, which takes approximately 11 minutes to answer all questions on the telephone. The call center conducting the survey will identify themselves as calling on behalf of CVEC. They will conducts calls Monday-Friday from 5 p.m. until 9 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Please take the time to answer truthfully and honestly as this will help us grow as a cooperative.
